

Fashion Designer Fatima


Life, activities, and motivation

17b Initiate a Textile Alliance



Following numerous fatal accidents in textile factories in Bangladesh and Pakistan, the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development initiates a textile alliance. The aim of the alliance is to improve social and ecological conditions in global textile production. Together with companies, NGOs and trade unions, the German government thus aims to support the sustainable production of textiles. In doing so, they work closely with local textile factories and ensure that child labor does not occur, environmentally harmful chemicals are not used and workers are not exploited.







8b Strengthening the Textile Alliance



The Alliance for Sustainable Textiles is a multi-actor partnership with around 135 members from business, politics, civil society, trade unions and standard organizations. As a strong alliance, they all want to work together to improve conditions in global textile production - from raw material production to disposal. The number of members is to be significantly increased through tax incentives.

17a Partnership for sustainable supply chains



Following the entry into force of the Supply Chain Act, the German government is holding talks with entrepreneurs to help them implement it. On this basis, all major German companies and SMEs commit to working with their global suppliers to introduce sustainability standards for all components of the supply chain. Suppliers receive the necessary know-how and long-term assurance of a partnership, and thus the financial resources to implement appropriate adjustments.

17c Starting signal for the European Green Deal



The European Green Deal is a roadmap to make the EU economy more sustainable. It aims to promote the efficient use of resources by moving to a clean and circular economy, halting climate change, tackling biodiversity loss and reducing pollution. In doing so, it strengthens cohesion in the EU in pursuit of the common goal of becoming the first climate-neutral continent.



12a Establishment of an industry initiative for circular economy



The German waste and recycling industry has saved more than 55 million t CO₂ eq/a over the past 20 years through a successful transformation process. Based on this success, the government is encouraging the formation of an industry initiative to promote the circular economy. More and more companies from the sector are being motivated to join this initiative. In the Recycling Management Act, priority is also to be given to all ecologically beneficial reusable products.



8c Improvement of working conditions



In addition to the Act on Securing Workers' Rights in the Meat Industry (GSA Fleisch), which has already been in force since July 2017, the slaughtering and processing of meat is to be permitted in the future only by the meat industry company's own employees and business owners. Due to the positive effect on working conditions, the approach is to be transferred to other areas, such as seasonal work.



8d Foundation of investor community for Green Start Ups



Green Start Ups, especially in the Green Tech sector, have high capital requirements even in the development phase. They are therefore dependent on outside capital. Due to the economic success of many innovative, sustainable companies, a Germany-wide investor community is forming, which predominantly invests in Green Start Ups. In the future, it will be much easier for Green Start Ups to obtain venture capital. The German government welcomes and supports the investor community.

Germany's technical universities are jointly establishing a Start Up Hub for Green Technology Solutions with the support of the German government and companies. Together, they will research and develop overarching solutions in shorter timeframes and bring them to industry in the form of innovative startups.

5a More parental leave for fathers



The German government has set itself the goal of increasing the proportion of fathers receiving parental allowance from around 34% today to 65% by 2030. A citizens' initiative therefore wants to submit a petition to use the averaged income of mother and father for the calculation of parental allowance. The initiative is convinced that this will remove a major obstacle to parental leave for fathers with widely differing parental incomes, and that the 65% rate can thus be achieved without further measures.

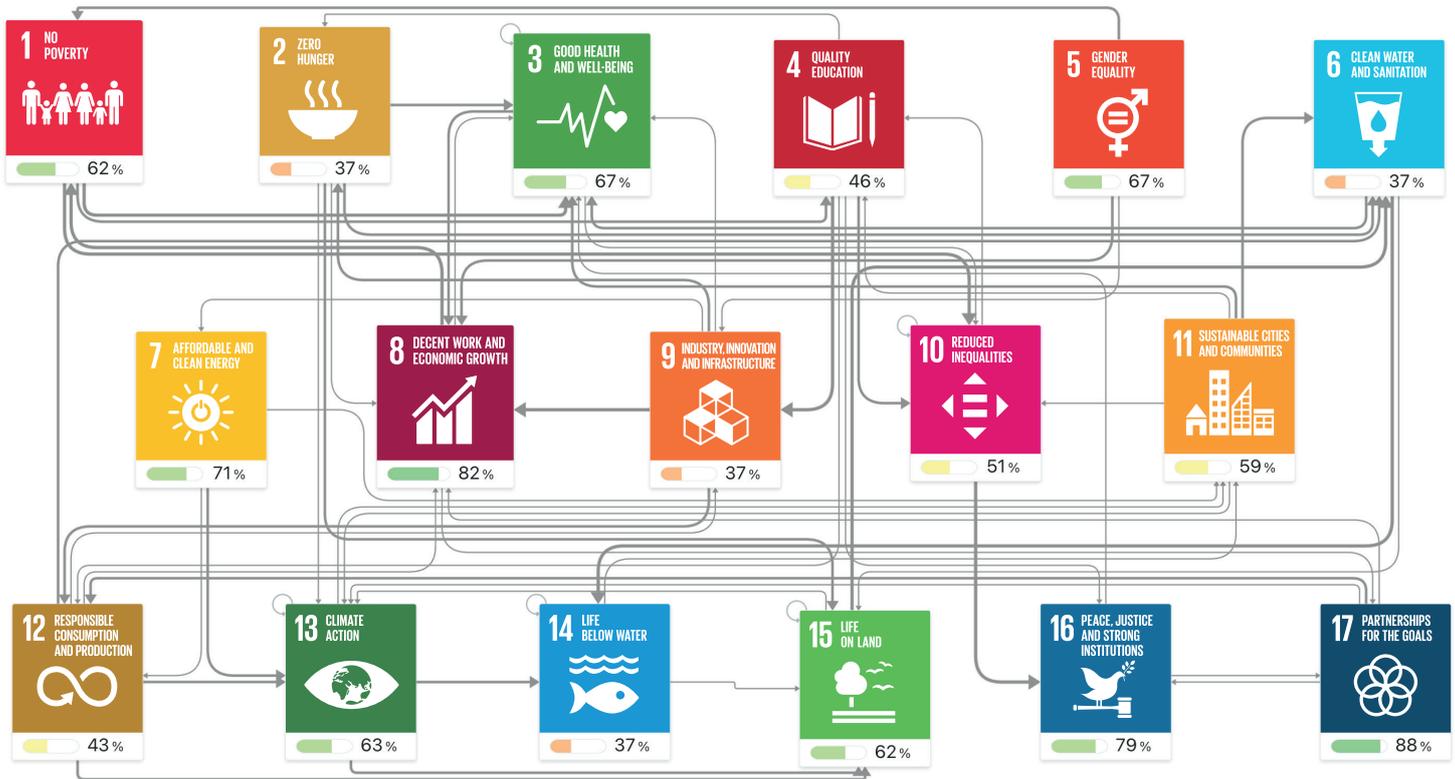

Ensure equal opportunities at all levels of education and structurally embed **education for sustainable development (ESD)** across all areas of learning.




Ensure **equal participation** of women in the labour market, prevent gender-based violence, and support women affected by violence.



Improve **water and aquatic ecosystem quality** (e.g., by reducing nitrate and phosphate inputs) and support global water security.



Advance the **energy transition** through efficient energy use, reduced energy consumption, and the further expansion of renewable energy generation.



Promote inclusive and sustainable economic growth, ensure **decent work** and high levels of employment, and support **sustainable supply chains**.



Strengthen **technical and social infrastructure**, maintain industrial competitiveness, and promote an open **culture of innovation**.



Ensure the **economic and social participation** of all citizens and promote inclusion, **equal opportunities**, and freedom from discrimination.



Ensure resource-efficient and **inclusive infrastructure** (mobility, housing, waste management) through **resilient urban development** with a focus on the common good.



Decouple **resource consumption** from economic growth, advance the **circular economy**, and take responsibility along global supply chains.



Achieve the goals of the **Paris Agreement** and reach greenhouse gas neutrality, while strengthening research on climate, **climate action, and climate adaptation**.



Ensure the **protection of oceans and coasts**, reduce nutrient inputs, and tackle illegal fishing, environmental damage, and marine litter.



Ensure the **protection and restoration of ecosystems**, promote sustainable forestry, and halt the accelerating loss of **biodiversity**.
